JAM RECIPE USING HERBS

4 cups fruit, chopped
2 cups sugar
3 tablespoons powdered pectin
1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
1 tablespoon fresh minced herbs

Stir fruit and sugar together in saucepan. Let sit for 10 minutes. Add pectin and juice.
Bring to boil over medium heat. Boil, stirring constantly for 5 minutes.
Reduce heat to low stirring for 3 more minutes.
Take off heat and stir in herbs.
Cool and bottle.

Herby Polenta Muffins

Ingredients:

- 275g SR flour
- 50g polenta (cornmeal)
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp Smoked Paprika
- ½ tsp crushed garlic
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp thyme
- 300 mL buttermilk
- 2 eggs, lightly whisked
- 70g cheddar cheese, grated
- 100ml vegetable oil
- 1 zucchini, grated and excess moisture squeezed out

For tin:

- ½ cup polenta (cornmeal) extra
- 2 tbsp melted butter

1. Preheat oven to 180°C. Grease a 12-hole muffin tin with melted butter and tip extra polenta into holes and shake around to coat the butter then turn tin upside down to remove excess.
2. Mix dry ingredients into a large bowl. In a separate bowl, mix all remaining ingredients. Slowly pour wet mixture into dry, stirring with a wooden spoon until incorporated and smooth. Pour mixture into prepared tin and bake for 15-20 minutes until muffins are risen and golden. Cool in tray for 5 minutes before turning out onto a wire rack.

Herb Damper

Ingredients:

- 3 cups Self Raising Flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/3 cup flat-leaf parsley leaves, roughly chopped
- 1 bunch chives, finely chopped
- 80g butter, cubed, chilled
- 1 cup milk, at room temperature

1. Preheat oven to 200°C. Line a large baking tray with baking paper. Sift flour and salt into a bowl. Stir in parsley and chives. Using your fingertips, rub butter into flour until mixture resembles fine breadcrumbs.
2. Make a well in the centre of dry ingredients. Add milk. Mix lightly with a flat-bladed knife until mixture starts to come together (add a little extra milk if necessary). Turn dough onto a lightly floured board. Knead lightly. Shape into a 3cm-thick, 20cm round. Place dough onto prepared tray.
3. Using a sharp knife, score top of damper into 8 wedges. Dust lightly with a little flour. Bake for 20 to 25 minutes or until damper is light golden and sounds hollow when tapped on base.



Lemon and Herb Cakes

Ingredients:

- 225g castor sugar
- 3 eggs
- 250ml milk
- 2 lemons, juice and very finely grated zest
- 250ml extra virgin olive oil
- 230g Self Raising flour
- 1 tbsp finely chopped lemon balm or lemon verbena (available from Hillview Herb Farm)

1. Prepare a 12-hole muffin tray by greasing and dusting with flour. Preheat oven to 180°C.
2. Combine milk, lemon juice, lemon zest and oil in a jug and whisk lightly together.
3. Using an electric beater, mix sugar and eggs until light and fluffy. Gradually add milk mixture, whisking lightly to incorporate.
4. Fold flour and herbs gently into wet mix until all combined. Spoon cake mix into prepared tray and bake for 15-20 minutes until golden.
5. Allow to cool for 10 minutes in tray before carefully removing to a wire rack. Serve warm or at room temperature.

HERB DAMPER ROLLS

2 cups SR Flour	30g butter	1 cup grated tasty cheese
¾ cup rolled oats	½ cup milk	½ cup water
1 tablespoon chopped chives		

Pre-heat oven to 220°C. Lightly grease baking tray.

Sift flour into bowl. Add butter, using fingertips to rub in until mixture is combined.

Mix in ½ cup of the cheese and ½ cup of the oats.

Make a well in the centre.

In a jug, combine the milk and the water. Pour into the well all at once, reserving 1 tablespoon of the liquid.

Using a knife, quickly mix to a soft sticky dough. Do not over-mix. Turn onto a floured surface and knead lightly.

Divide dough into 6 even-sized pieces. Lightly knead each into a ball and press slightly.

Place on tray and brush tops with reserved milk.

In a bowl, combine remaining cheese, remaining oats and chives. Sprinkle over rolls.

Bake in oven for 12-15 minutes. Allow to cool on a wire rack.
