DATE LOAF RECIPE

Pre-heat oven to 160° C

1½ cups chopped dates

¾ cup white sugar (not caster)

125g butter or margarine

½ teaspoon bi-carb soda

Put all above ingredients in a bowl. Add 1 cup boiling water. Let stand until just warm.

ADD 1¾ cups SR Flour

1 teaspoon nutmeg

Mix well.

Bake in loaf tin for 1hr5mins or until cooked.
